Student Identified as having Suicidal Statements and/or Behaviors Is student safe? Have they ingested anything or do they have any means of self harm on their person?

Yes, Student is safe—notify an administrator of the situation with the student and do not leave them alone.

Admin determines school mental health lead and begins assisting with the response protocol

No-Student is not safe—Call SRO, 911 and notify an administrator of the situation ASAP

Notify Behavioral Health Coordinator of the situation. Debriefing will be scheduled for the team.

School Mental Health Lead as determined by Admin will administer the CSSRS

## Don't...

1. Self Harm Checklist

Do...

- 2. Student Information Sheet
- Consult with admin/BH Coordinator/other SW
- 4. Call parents\* w/ administrator

- Leave student alone
- 2. Allow student to go to bathroom/ locker alone
- 3. Allow student to leave school by self

# LOW RISK

- 1. Parents\* notified of student's concerns
  BEFORE end of school day
- 2. Provide Resources/follow up with resources
- 3. May complete the Action Plan
- 4. Encourage parents to follow up with a therapist/doctor

#### With Parent and Admin:

- 1. Explain situation and results of the CSSRS and Self Harm Checklist
- 2. Complete Parent Release of Liability
- 3. Have parent complete Release of Information Form
- 4. With student and parent, complete the Student Action Plan
- 5. Provide Parent with Resource Sheet

#### Next Step:

- Notify BH Coordinator of the outcome of the situation
- 2. Complete the google Threat Risk Assessment Form

#### \*CYFD Involvement:

- 1. If the student's distress is the result of abuse, neglect or exploitation by the parent/guardian. DO not contact the parent, but call CYFD.
- 2. If the parent refuses to take the student for mental health services, call CYFD.
